



The Magic of a Future

Fantasia A/B Al 101 – Understanding the Basics and Beyond

This presentation provides a comprehensive introduction to Artificial Intelligence (AI), exploring its fundamental concepts, history, and current applications. Building Partnerships and Collaborations

Strong partnerships and collaborations can enhance services for young people while optimizing resources for organizations. Hawaii Youth Services Network (HYSN) has successfully developed and sustained strategic partnerships to address key issues such as youth homelessness, increasing youth voice in civic affairs, and teen pregnancy/STI prevention.

This session will highlight successful collaborations, including the Youth Homelessness System Improvement Project, the Hawaii Interagency State Youth Network of Care, and the Hawaii Children and Youth Summit. These initiatives have led to increased funding, stronger service coordination, and more effective support systems for youth.

Participants will explore the benefits and challenges of creating partnerships, as well as the processes necessary for sustaining them. Through discussion and an interactive exercise, attendees will identify potential partners for their own work and gain practical strategies for fostering successful collaborations.

By the end of the session, participants will be able to describe ways organizations can partner, recognize key benefits of collaborations, and identify potential challenges that may arise in partnership development.

Unfortunately, many board members can feel disconnected, underutilized, and uninformed, leading to diminished participation, reduced support, and growing disengagement. This session features a panel of board members dedicated to youth safety and well-being, who will share their insights on fostering strong governance, supporting mission-driven initiatives, and ensuring board members remain actively engaged.

How the Transportation Industry can be a Key Partner in Protecting Youth from Trafficking and Exploitation

As youth travel to and from school, work and other activities, they interact with various facets of the transportation industry, including school buses, local transit, and rideshare services. They may also stop at locations such as gas stations, rest stops, travel plazas, and convenience stores. Each of these touchpoints represents a critical opportunity to identify and support vulnerable youth, prevent exploitation, and connect trafficking survivors with resources, Safe Place locations, and law enforcement.

Since 2009, TAT (Truckers Against Trafficking) has partnered with industry leaders who are stepping up in the fight against human trafficking. To date, over two million individuals in the transportation sector have been trained and registered with TAT.

This panel discussion will feature representatives from the bus, truck stop, and shipping industries who have leveraged their roles to protect vulnerable youth and strengthen community-wide responses to trafficking. Attendees will also learn about free resources available to prevent, identify, and respond to potential cases of child trafficking.

Al for Streamlined Grant Writing: A Hands-On Workshop for Youth Nonprofits

"Al for Streamlined Grant Writing: A Hands-On Workshop for Youth Nonprofits" is designed to introduce attendees to the effective use of artificial intelligence tools in simplifying and enhancing the grant writing process. Tailored for beginners, this interactive workshop walks participants through the practical application of Al to draft key sections of grant proposals, perform research, and develop program designs. Through live demonstrations and hands-on exercises, participants will explore how Al can help streamline time-consuming tasks in grant writing, such as creating the statement of need and drafting budgets, while maintaining human oversight to ensure strategic alignment and accuracy. The session highlights Al as a tool to complement, not replace, the critical thinking and expertise required for successful grant proposals. Objectives: Understand the fundamentals of Al and its role in the grant writing process. Learn how to apply Al to draft essential sections of grant proposals, including program design and budgets. Identify best practices for integrating Al tools into grant research and writing, ensuring a balance between technology and human insight.

Strategies for Youth Homelessness Prevention

This panel discussion will explore innovative approaches to preventing youth homelessness, demonstrating the importance of rethinking traditional prevention strategies. Attendees will gain insight into three distinct initiatives designed to support youth and young adults before they experience homelessness. Panelists will share the success of a Direct Cash Transfer pilot engaged 45 Transition Age Youth (TAY) in San Francisco, highlighting how direct financial assistance can help stabilize housing. The discussion will also cover a growing partnership with the San Francisco Unified School District, which focuses on identifying and supporting youth and families at the greatest risk of homelessness. Additionally, panelists will provide insights from the federally-funded Youth Homelessness Prevention Demonstration Program, offering early learnings on collaborative, community-wide prevention planning.

Attendees will leave with a deeper understanding of how direct financial support can promote housing stability, how school-based outreach can help intervene before homelessness occurs, and how community-wide prevention strategies are shaping the future of youth homelessness response.

Sorcerer's Apprentice 3 Collective Transformation: Prevention and Collaboration for

At-Risk Families in Florida

For over 40 years, the Florida Network of Youth and Family Services has supported at-risk families through prevention-based strategies. This workshop highlights Stop Now and Plan (SNAP), an evidence-based, trauma-informed, gender-specific Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT) approach designed to slow decision-making and promote safety, stability, and connection through skill-building and early intervention.

Participants will gain an understanding of the SNAP program, the risks faced by vulnerable families, and the importance of early risk identification. The session will explore how shifting the focus from intervention to prevention helps divert youth from negative pathways while enhancing long-term stability through community collaboration and engagement. Attendees will leave with practical strategies for applying CBT techniques, insights on how cross-sector collaboration can reduce vulnerability and systemic costs, and real-world examples of evidence-based models being successfully implemented at community, county, and state levels.

Safe Place® is a national outreach and prevention program providing immediate help and safety for youth in crisis. This community-based initiative partners with more than 20,000 businesses and locations—including restaurants, convenience stores, fire stations, public buses, and libraries—to serve as Safe Place sites. These locations display the recognizable Safe Place sign and connect youth with critical resources and support.

As part of the Safe Place program, TXT 4 HELP provides a nationwide, 24-hour text-for-support service for youth facing abuse, bullying, family problems, depression, suicidal thoughts, and more. Youth can text "SAFE" to 4HELP (44357) to locate the nearest Safe Place or reply with '2chat' to connect with a master's-level mental health professional for one-on-one, real-time support. TXT 4 HELP is available 24/7/365, ensuring young people can reach out for confidential support whenever they need it.
